
HISTORY OF WESTONBIRT


Westonbirt House was built in the late 1800s by Robert Holford, one of the richest men in England, and was the most expensive and luxurious country house created in the whole of the Victorian era.

A school for over 90 years, its stunning architecture and interior design, as well as extensive parkland, make Westonbirt House a dramatic and exciting environment in which to live and learn.

The Cotswolds region of England is considered one of the most beautiful parts of the UK. It is home to several members of the Royal family, with links to horse eventing and polo. With its rolling countryside and quintessentially English

villages, the Cotswolds is a popular holiday destination, and offers a huge variety of outdoor activities, from walking and riding, to sailing and other water sports. Set in a county steeped in history, with castles and palaces dating from Roman times, Westonbirt School is within half an hour of the World Heritage City of Bath, with its Roman Baths and great shopping opportunities, and is just 90 minutes from London.

WEEKLY TIMETABLE

A combination of high-quality, tailored English language classes, interesting real-world projects and academies alongside English host students, as well as exciting excursions to key English tourist sights, and fun evening and weekend activities, combine to make Westonbirt Summer School the perfect summer holiday.

LEARNING

Students are placed into English language groups for morning lessons dependent on age and English ability. The ages, number and ability of students change week to week, with flexible groupings to meet their needs. We ensure that all students are happy, challenged and grow in confidence.

- · 15 hours of core English lessons
- 5 hours of conversational English during Team Project Challenge alongside their UK host students

EVENINGS

After a busy day of learning and fun, each day has time for relaxation before dinner, when students can enjoy the beautiful grounds, read in their attractive boarding room, or hang out with friends. They will also be able to make contact with family, to tell them about the day's adventures.

After dinner, children take part in social activities, including quizzes, discos, and karaoke or movie nights. As well as lots of fun, this down time is a perfect opportunity for students to continue to use their English in an unpressured environment. Bedtimes are staggered depending on age.

TRIPS

There are 3 excursions each week. Full-day excursions take place on Saturdays, with half-day trips on Wednesdays and an optional short shopping trip to a local town on Sunday if the children aren't leaving that day.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE TUITION

KEY FACTS

Age: 10-16 years old

Hours per week: 15 hours per week core English lessons

Maximum class size: Maximum of 12 students per class

Course content: General English lessons in the morning plus group conversation and communication practice in the afternoon Team Project Challenge lessons. Classes to include:

- · Grammar in real-life contexts
- · Pronunciation practice
- Written and spoken accuracy
- Skills: reading, writing, listening and speaking

Course materials: A mix of our General English text books and authentic materials



On arrival: Students will be tested to decide the best class level for their needs. We stream English Proficiency into groups of Beginner and Elementary, (A1) &(A2), Intermediate and Upper Intermediate (B1) & (B2) and Advanced and Proficiency English groups. (C1 & C2) Students at C1 & C2 level can be placed on to our fluent speaker programme.

FLUENT SPEAKER PROGRAMME

Students who are proficient English speakers at C1 & C2 level or equivalent, will follow a classroom-based programme of engaging topic work in English as opposed to the programme of English language lessons that our other students will follow in the mornings.

MONDAY-FRIDAY MORNING CLASSES

Morning classes start each day with reading, writing and listening skills. Focus on Fluency sessions are designed to encourage every student to speak with confidence and ease, and all tasks provide optimum speaking and pronunciation practice. Lastly, a daily Vocabulary Clinic will link with the functional language needed for the afternoon, working as an integrated group with UK host students on the Team Project Challenge.

PLUS

2 x 1 hour per week on a research task, learning about up-and-coming cultural visits and developing local and historical knowledge of the UK.



TEAM PROJECT CHALLENGE

On 3 afternoons each week, students take part in the Team Project Challenge. These fun and competitively orientated tasks encourage our students to use their growing language skills in group conversation alongside their UK host students. They are carefully designed to develop communication, problem-solving, critical thinking, listening, presentation and leadership skills. Examples of the possible challenges are given below. The challenges for the 10–13-year-olds will be more practical whereas for the 14–16-year-olds the challenges will involve more developed communication skills.

ENGINEERING CHALLENGE

Putting their engineering skills to the test, this challenge could involve constructing a self-powered cart, possibly powered by elastic bands, or similar. Teams will compete to see whose cart can travel the furthest, fastest and complete a task.

ENTREPRENEURIAL CHALLENGE

Students will research, develop and market a brand-new board game, finally pitching their idea to potential investors. They will explore budgets, market research and profit margins.

DESIGN CHALLENGES

Whether designing clothes for a new school or sports team or the advertising for a new business, our students have the opportunity to put their creative skills to practical use.

ECO CHALLENGE

Students explore the unique environment of Westonbirt and the Arboretum, working on environmental projects and could be challenged to assess the ecological impact of our Summer School and work out and present what actions are required to make it more eco-friendly.

KNIGHTLY PURSUITS

Students experience a range of skills required to be a knight, and find out what life would be like in Medieval England. This is a fun course, with numerous practical activities, designed for enjoyment and to provide some unique experiences. For ages 10-13.



AGADEMIES AND MULTI-ACTIVITY OPTIONS

Westonbirt's outstanding facilities, extensive grounds and specialist teaching staff allow us to offer professional tuition in a wide range of high-quality Academy opportunities on 4 afternoons each week. Students receive up to 8 hours of coaching in their chosen Academies per week and are joined by UK student hosts, who will provide lots of opportunities for conversation and extending English language skills.

Students can choose one Academy each week from those listed below. (Not all Academies are available each week.) Students who do not wish to specialise in 1 specific Academy each week can choose the Multi-Activity option where they will usually do 2 activities each afternoon - where

possible they will be able to choose their favoured activities. Students whose chosen Academy does not run each afternoon (e.g. Horse Riding) will participate in the Multi-Activity programme on the other days.

GOLF

Westonbirt's very own 9-hole golf course is ideal for all abilities.

What is involved: Daily Lessons (4 x 2 hours) Whether you are a seasoned golfer or an inquisitive beginner, our Golf Academy will help you learn and improve your game. The course will concentrate on the core aspects of this increasingly popular sport, such as driving, iron play, chipping, putting and bunker shots. Loan clubs provided.

POLO

Incredible polo ponies to suit all abilities of riders from complete beginners through to advanced. A chance to meet two of England's top International polo players and learn all about the sport, it's an opportunity not to be missed! Two x 2 hour sessions to be held at the prestigious Beaufort Polo Club. HPA qualified first class coaching using top-class facilities. From fine tuning techniques on wooden horses, learning to neck rein and stick and ball on polo ponies, the coaches will have students feeling comfortable under saddle, from stick and balling to playing slow chukkas in session 2. (£190 per week)

WEEKS 2,4

WATER SPORTS

Students take to the Cotswold Lakes to hone their skills for paddle boarding and kayaking.

What is involved: There are 2 sessions, each lasting 1½ hours. The first session is on stand-up paddle boards (SUP's.) The second session is kayaking. Each session will have an element of instruction with plenty of time for fun games on the lake. Kit will be provided. Sessions are planned and delivered by qualified instructors. (£40 per week)

WEEKS 2.4

HORSE RIDING

The Cotswolds is famous horse-riding country, and home to the internationallyrenowned Badminton and Gatcombe Horse Trials.

What is involved: This Academy gives students the chance to develop their riding skills for 4 hours per week (2 x 2-hour sessions with a guaranteed 1 ½ hours riding in each session). Students will take lessons in the riding school, working on walking, trotting and cantering. In the second session students will enjoy a hack in the beautiful Gloucestershire countryside. All abilities welcome. (£120 per week)

PERFORMING ARTS

Westonbirt School boasts vibrant and exciting Music and Drama departments. This Academy is a creative combination of music, drama and dance, leading to a performance at the end of the week, using the school's performing arts facilities and expert tuition.

WEEKS 1.3

TENNIS

Expert coaching for players of all abilities in this hugely popular sport, using Westonbirt's hard courts.

What is involved: Students will learn all aspects of the sport, from understanding the grip, forward and backhand strokes, serving, volleying, and court positioning. At the end of the week, children will take part in the Westonbirt Summer School Open.

WEEKS 1,2,3,4

COOKERY

Westonbirt School is a provider of highly regarded cookery courses, and our international students have access to our newly refurbished cookery room to enjoy a gastronomic Academy.

What is involved: Students will learn a range of classic cooking techniques, creating a different dish each day, so that by the end of the week, they have the skills to create a three-course meal.

WEEKS 1,2,3,4

FOOTBALL

Our Football academy provides our students with the opportunity to develop their skills.

The academy will focus on individual and team development, including ball manipulation and performance training, small sided games 2v2's and 3v3's, positional and transitional scenarios, patterns of play and tactical awareness. 5v5's and 1lv11's.

Training is delivered in two groups, 10 to 12's and 13 to 16's.

WEEKS 1,3

MULTI-ACTIVITY OPTION

Those students not wishing to specialise can take part in this Multi-Activity opportunity, where they will have the chance to try a different activity every afternoon. Students will take part in up to 2 activities per day from the list below. Where possible a choice will be given. Options may include: Fencing, Basketball, Swimming, Archery, Survival skills, Football, Touch rugby, Badminton, Kwik cricket, Art/craft, Water polo, Softball/Rounders and Volleyball.

The Westonbirt evening activity and weekend programme embodies our spirit of fun and is central in helping our students to build friendships. UK host students join international students for a wide variety of activities, including:

The day starts with a late breakfast and staff will organise the students into activities depending on the level of energy and the wishes of the students.

The beautiful medieval architecture, museums and shopping opportunities make this a popular option for our international students.


TETBURY

ACCOMMODATION


